DENVER –The Associates of Otolaryngology/Colorado Sinus Institute have added yet another talented mind to their roster of specialists devoted to the head and neck.

Dr. Jeffrey L. Cutler, a specialist in nasal and sinus disease, was previously the Director of Rhinology and Nasal Sinus Surgery at Walter Reed Army Medical Center in Washington D.C. During that time, he helped develop an endoscopic anterior skull base team with his neurosurgical colleagues. With this coordinated effort, soldiers, family members, and retirees benefited from state-of-the-art endoscopic surgical approaches to repair traumatic injuries, and treat benign and malignant tumors of the anterior skull base.

Throughout his education, internship, residency and career, Dr. Cutler has dedicated himself to caring for patients with a wide variety of ear, nose and throat disorders. He is a strong advocate of tailoring treatment options to meet the specific individual needs of his patients. Well-trained in all aspects of the otolaryngology field, Dr. Cutler is deft at treating patients of all ages and conditions. “I believe that my role as a healthcare advocate begins with listening and understanding my patients’ concerns...” remarks Dr. Cutler. “This way, I can provide the most effective and technologically advanced options to meet their treatment needs.”

“The field of nasal and sinus diseases continues to be my particular interest.” says Dr. Cutler. “Sinus disease has a variety of causes, and I strive to educate my patients on proper care so that they can partner with me in managing their nasal, sinus and allergic diseases. I enjoy teaming up with each patient to formulate a “game plan” or plan of attack to get to the root of their symptoms and design a solution together. Nothing gives me more satisfaction than to know I’m helping someone to not only improve their health, but to avoid any future problems as well.” Dr. Cutler has helped pioneer clinic-based procedural treatments for

sinusitis, and has lectured and taught instructional courses all over the country regarding these innovative techniques. In addition to lecturing, Dr. Cutler has authored several scientific articles and book chapters dealing with a variety of ear, nose and throat disorders.

Dr. Cutler is Board Certified in Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery and is fellowship trained in Rhinology and Nasal Sinus Surgery. He performed his undergraduate work at Brigham Young University in Provo, UT, and received his medical degree from Tulane University Medical Center in New Orleans, LA. Dr. Cutler then completed his General Surgery Internship, Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery Residency, and Rhinology Fellowship at Vanderbilt University Medical Center in Nashville, TN. He is an active member of two professional affiliations, the American Academy of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery, and the American Rhinological Society.

Dr. Cutler is also the Quest Recipient – Excellence in Patient Care, Walter Reed Army Medical Center – 2008 and 2009. He was named the Best Consultant to the Vanderbilt Emergency Department in 2003, and received the James W. McLaurin Award, Distinguished Thesis on an Otorhinolaryngology subject, Tulane University School of Medicine in 2000.

Dr. Cutler, outnumbered at home with a wife and three young daughters, loves to be an active coach in anything his girls are willing to learn. The family enjoys foreign travel and exploring new locations. “We’re a very outdoorsy family, we’re always out somewhere, hiking, etc...” says Dr. Cutler. “Spending so much time outdoors really drives home the point I try to make with patients regarding allergies and controlling triggers, etc. to avoid allergy attacks. Yes, environmental factors will always exist to exacerbate allergy symptoms, but if you can do your part to avoid triggers and minimize exposure, then you can indeed enjoy the outdoors, even with allergies.”
